2012-13 FAFSA Submission

The deadline for completing the 2012-13 FAFSA was April 17, 2012. The funding award for 2011-12 ends June 30, 2012. If you have not completed your FAFSA, you are in jeopardy of losing financial aid to cover future terms. Do not delay, please complete your FAFSA at the FAFSA website at www.fafsa.gov. Our School Code is 010319 (Medix School).

FAFSA VERIFICATION

30% or more of all FAFSA submissions are selected for a process called "Verification" requiring the Financial Aid Office to verify certain information submitted on the FAFSA. If you are contacted by one of the Financial Aid Administrators, please be prepared to provide copies of your Federal Income Tax Return (1040/1040A/EZ) and W-2s as well as complete the 2012-13 Verification Form. Your financial aid cannot be processed until this is completed.

Failed Course/Withdrawal Repeats

If you are repeating a class due to failure or withdrawal, you must see financial aid for repackaging. Tuition charges apply and your financial aid may be affected. Please schedule an appointment as soon as possible.
